Medications: Camp Goodtimes

Camp Goodtimes is a medical cancer camp, and we have registered nurses/nurse practitioners and physicians on site 24x7 to attend to camper's medical needs—including administering medications. It is important to include all medications your camper is currently taking in the medications section of the application. You can also update that section right up until camp starts. Once at camp, during check in, you will meet with the nurse/nurse assigned to your kid(s)' cabin and discuss all medications, doses, etc.

Medication Requirements

- Medications we need to know about include prescription and over-the-counter medicines, such as vitamins and supplements
- <u>All medications need to be brought in their original containers</u>
- Enough of the medicine to cover the week should be brought to camp, and a bit more just to be sure
- Inhalers and epi-pens need to be brought by the camper family for asthma and anaphylactic reactions to allergies
- Camp nurses will round on campers multiple times a day to administer meds at the appropriate time of day required for each med
- Medications cannot be kept in camper's cabins, they will be handed over to the nursing staff at check in and will be kept in their care for the duration of camp

Restrictions

• It is our policy that we will not administer cannabis products, such as CBD oil, while at camp. Please do not send these supplies to camp.
